Every year, Veterans Day is observed on November 11 in the United States. On this significant occasion, we unite to express our deep appreciation for the sacrifices made by veterans and their families, both on the battlefield and at home, in defense of our freedom.

In Milpitas, we have a Veterans Commission that actively serves members from every branch of the United States Armed Forces. The seven-member commission is dedicated to advocating for and delivering outstanding service to Milpitas veterans. Each year, the Milpitas Veterans Commission recognizes a veteran who has generously contributed to the community beyond their professional duties. This year, Master Sergeant (Ret.) Jeannie Lam is the City's *Veteran of the Year*. She honorably retired from the Air National Guard in 2022 after 20 years of service. She served as the Aviation Resource Management Non-Commissioned Officer In Charge (NCOIC) with the 129th Rescue Wing (RQW) at Moffett Field, California. Throughout her service, Jeannie deployed to Africa, Jordan, and Afghanistan. Today, she continues to give back as a teacher in the Milpitas School District and a dedicated volunteer.

Jeannie will be honored for her service and dedication at the Veterans Day ceremony on November 11 at the Civic Center Plaza. We are immensely proud to call Jeannie Lam one of our own, and we thank her for her extraordinary service and commitment.

MILPITAS TO RECEIVE \$2.9 MILLION FEDERAL GRANT TO ENHANCE PEDESTRIAN SAFETY

The City of Milpitas has been awarded \$2.9 million in federal grant funding to enhance pedestrian safety at intersections near local schools and reduce crashes along the City's school route network. The U.S. Department of Transportation will provide funding through the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Grant Program, a key component of President Biden's bipartisan infrastructure bill. The City submitted its grant application in May 2024 and was awarded the full amount requested for project design and implementation.

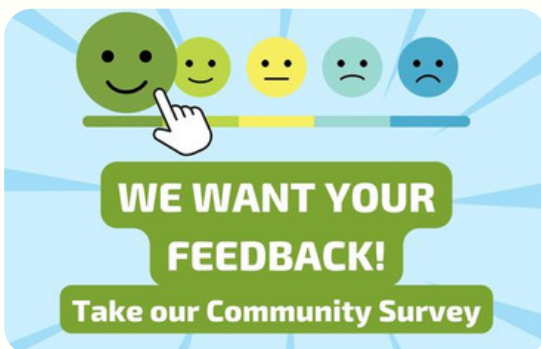
EXPERIENCE HOLIDAY MAGIC: TREE LIGHTING & COOKIES WITH SANTA!

308 Sango Court Apartments, 308 Sango Ct., a five-story over one-level parking 85-unit affordable housing development by The Pacific Companies.

The exterior stucco work and installation of plug walls in the corridors are progressing at the development. See photos below.



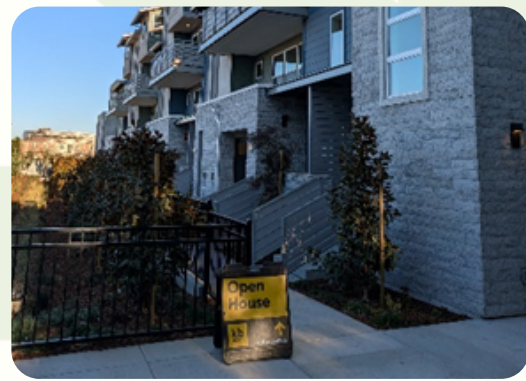
Pinnacle Townhomes, 1752 Houret Ct., eight three-story buildings consist of 56-unit townhome-style condominiums with 24 ADUs residential development by City Ventures.

Truss packages are being installed with a three man crew at Building 5, a six-plex with six ADUs. See the photo below.



Lumen Townhomes, 2001 Tarob Ct., two four-story buildings with a total of 32-unit townhome-style condominiums residential development by KB Homes.

A temporary occupancy permit (TCO) for Lumen at Building #2 was issued to allow the earlier start of occupancy of the completed 16 residential units. See photos below.

Concrete work is in progress on the ground level garage floor. See the photos below.

The Vet Clinic, for tenant improvements for new veterinary clinic located at 105 Serra Way at an estimated construction cost of \$200,000.
