City of Milpitas Launches Microenterprise Assistance Program
Now Accepting Applications for \$200,000 in CDBG Grants

Milpitas, CA – February 19, 2025 – FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

The City of Milpitas continues to provide resources to the business community recovering from economic impacts caused by the pandemic. The City of Milpitas' Microenterprise Assistance Program (MEAP) is designed to provide economic assistance to microenterprises within Milpitas. [FORWARD](#), the trusted partner in program administration for local governments, has partnered with the City of Milpitas to administer the MEAP. The application period for MEAP is now open and closes on Friday, March 14 at 6:00 PM.

The City of Milpitas has allocated \$200,000 of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds to provide up to 40 microenterprises each with \$5,000 in grant funding via MEAP. The awards will provide a financial cushion and help alleviate the economic challenges faced by microenterprises in Milpitas. Priority will be given to eligible commercial and home-based daycare operators that apply. In 2024, MEAP provided \$2,000 CDBG-funded grants to 25 eligible microenterprises totaling \$50,000. This year's program reaffirms the City's economic support of Milpitas' microenterprise community since 2020.

According to City Manager Ned Thomas, "By partnering with FORWARD, we are actively supporting the financial resilience and growth of Milpitas businesses, reinforcing our City's reputation as a thriving hub for innovation and economic opportunity."

To be eligible for the program, microenterprises must:

- Operate within Milpitas city limits;
- Not exceed five (5) employees (including business owners, W2 employees and sole proprietors);
- Operate as a for-profit enterprise;
- Provide an active business license in good standing issued by the City of Milpitas;
- Provide a current North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) Code;
- Have a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) issued by SAM.gov to be considered for funding; and
- The business owner's income must be at or below 80% of the Area Median Income (AMI) for Santa Clara County.

Eligible Uses of Grant Funding Include:

- Rent and mortgage
- Operating expenses
- Payroll

- Utility payments
- Supplies and equipment

The Milpitas City Council approved FORWARD as the program administrator to assist with community outreach, application support, grant funds disbursement, and screening for eligibility in a way that uses taxpayer dollars efficiently. Applicants can expect the following:

- Apply via the MEAP website, available in multiple languages
- Access to application support available in multiple languages via phone, text, and email
- Meet geographic area requirements by operating within Milpitas city limits
- Submit proof of active Unique Entity Identifier (UEI)
- A Business Tax Return from 2023 or a Personal Tax Return from 2023 (if business income is shown on personal return)
- Provide a W-9 form, and a government-issued photo ID
