Democratizing Artificial Intelligence (AI) is key to economic development, and Milpitas is leading the way! On February 10th, the City hosted an "AI Made Simple" workshop, presented by the City of Milpitas and FalconX, empowered local entrepreneurs and SMBs (small to medium-sized businesses) to integrate AI into their workflows. Thanks to the expertise of Ashish Bansal and Deepa Vivekanandan, over 150 attendees gained practical insights through real-world case studies of Milpitas-based businesses. A big thank you to our partners Milpitas Unified School District, SiliconValley SBDC, SJSU, and Milpitas Chamber of Commerce for their support in helping us foster innovation in our community.



MILPITAS SECURES \$2 MILLION FEDERAL GRANT FOR TRAFFIC SAFETY ENHANCEMENTS



The City of Milpitas has been awarded \$2,064,330 in federal funding through the Local Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP), administered by the Federal Highway Administration. The grant, announced on February 21 by Caltrans, will support critical traffic safety upgrades aimed at improving visibility and pedestrian protection across the City. The project will fund the installation of retroreflective backplates, leading pedestrian intervals (LPI), enhanced signage, daylighting, and beacons at all 72 city-owned traffic signals, as well as three unsignalized intersections. These enhancements align with Milpitas' commitment to safer streets, providing long-term benefits for drivers, cyclists, and pedestrians.

APPLICATIONS NOW BEING ACCEPTED FOR MILPITAS MICROENTERPRISE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (MEAP)

The application period for the City of the Milpitas Microenterprise Assistance Program (MEAP) is now open. This program is designed to provide economic assistance to microenterprises within Milpitas. FORWARD, the trusted partner in program administration for local governments, has partnered with the City of Milpitas to administer the MEAP. The City of Milpitas has allocated \$200,000 of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds for MEAP in order to provide up to 40 Milpitas microenterprises each with \$5,000 in grant funding. CITY OF MILPITAS RELEASES RESULTS OF COMMUNITY SATISFACTION SURVEY

The City of Milpitas has released the results of its latest community satisfaction survey, conducted by Fairbank, Maslin, Mauling, Metz & Associates (FM3) from December 12 to 30, 2024. The survey, which collected feedback from a representative sample of 647 adult residents, provides valuable insights into the perceptions and priorities of the Milpitas community. Key findings include:

- 86% of residents are satisfied with the overall quality of life in Milpitas.
- 78% of residents are satisfied with overall City services. A solid majority of residents feel that City government is effectively managing tax dollars and planning for the future.

The City of Milpitas and the Santa Clara County Library District (SCCLD) have collaborated on a new StoryWalk® installation at Murphy Park in central Milpitas. A StoryWalk® includes pages taken directly from a children's book, mounted and installed along an outdoor path. While walking down the path, children and families are encouraged to read and follow the story, which is a great way to develop early literacy skills and promote physical activity with young children. The Milpitas Library is less than a three mile drive from Murphy Park. The current story on display is *Someday, Maybe* by Diana Murray, one of this year's Silicon Valley Reads companion books for kids. There are 17 individual panels circling the children's playground in Murphy Park. Come check it out!




Do you have stuff you need to get rid of? Did you know there are several **FREE** convenient waste disposal services available to Milpitas residents?

Self-Haul Voucher Program

Request up to two self-haul vouchers per year to dispose of bulky items at the Zanker Material Processing Facility. Each voucher allows the disposal of one vehicle load (up to 3 cubic yards) of approved items. Call Milpitas Sanitation at 408-988-4500 for more details about what is accepted, and to request a voucher.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Drop-off

Safely dispose of Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) such as old paint, pesticides, and cleaners by scheduling a drop-off appointment at a Santa Clara County hazardous waste collection facility. To make an appointment, visit HHW.org or call 408-299-7300. Proper disposal of HHW helps protect the environment and keeps harmful materials out of the waste stream.



NEIGHBORHOOD CLEAN-UP EVENTS

Look for annual Neighborhood Clean-Up Events and sign-up to bring your large, bulky items to dispose of in a debris bin dumpster. These clean-up events occur monthly from spring through fall. Registration is required, and each household is limited to one truckload (up to 3 cubic yards) per event, with participation in only one event per year. DEVELOPMENT PROJECT CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

308 Sango Court Apartments, 308 Sango Ct., a five-story over one-level parking 85-unit affordable housing development by The Pacific Companies.

Exterior work is progressing well. Stucco scratch (1st) coat being applied after approval of wire lath. See photos below.





Sunnyhills Apartments, (Sunnyhills Investors LLC) 1730 Sunnyhills Dr., an in-fill project that consists of six apartment buildings with a total of 44 units, a leasing office and carport structures.

Building F has now been complete, completing the last permit for the project. All permits have now been complete for this project. See the photos below.



City Of Milpitas Sunnyhill Park, 395 Coelho St, City park restroom renovation

The restroom renovation including accessible drinking fountains and electrical room at the Sunnyhill Park has been completed. See the photos below.



Altitude Trampoline Park, located at 147 Great Mall Dr.

To allow an earlier start of construction, a temporary permit for Altitude Trampoline Park, a trampoline amusement center at the Great Mall was issued.

DEVELOPMENT PROJECT CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Pinnacle Townhomes, 1752 Houret Ct., eight three-story buildings consist of 56-unit townhome-style condominiums with 24 ADUs residential development by City Ventures. Building 2, a 9-plex with three ADUs is in progress with the installation of the Active Vapor system. Building 4, a 6-plex with six ADUs in the Development has started first floor framing. Main Street Palace, 1316 S Main St., a 4-story (3 over podium), 18 unit's condominium development over 1-level of garage by SJ Main St LLC

The removal of the temporary forms on the 1st level are in progress and they are preparing for framing to begin on the floors above. See the photo below.



TTLC Main Street Townhomes, 612 S Main St. nine three-story buildings consisting of 57 townhomes residential development by Toll Brothers

Grading at the site has been completed and they are awaiting the approval and issuance of the building permits. See the photo below.



Extra Shine Car Wash, 554 S Main St, new automatic car wash by Extra Shine Car Wash Inc.

Site work is still in progress. The CMU walls of the trash enclosure are being constructed and some of the light pole bases have been poured. The car washing equipment set up has been completed. See the below aerial photos.



BUILDING PERMIT AND OCCUPANCY

Building permit applications were submitted by the following:

Milpitas Fire Station #1, for installation of a modular building to house the City's Office of Emergency Services located at 777 S Main St at an estimated construction cost of \$818,894.

Shell Station, to remove and replace existing underground storage tanks, dispensers, piping and associated equipment at their current facility located at 12 N Park Victoria Dr. at an estimated construction cost of \$750,000.

KLA Plus, a semiconductor manufacturing company, for tenant improvements at their existing facility to create a new server room located at 5 Technology Dr at an estimated construction cost of \$350,000.

Building permits were issued to the following:

Rise At The District Townhomes Phase 2 (Pulte Homes), 1355 California Cl., for construction of 2 out of 8 buildings at an estimated construction cost of \$9.6 M. Together with the Apex phase, the two phases consist of 96 stacked townhomes/condos and 35 traditional townhomes for a total of 131 units. An apartment building for 75 low and moderate income units is also part of the development and will be under a separate permit.

Townplace Suites by Marriott, for tenant improvement of an existing hotel located at 1428 Falcon Dr. at an estimated construction cost of \$831,075.

St. Elizabeth Church, for renovation of their sanctuary located at 750 Sequoia Dr. at an estimated construction cost of \$750,000.

HCT American, a product compliance and wireless testing company for tenant improvement at their new facility located at 840 Yosemite Way at an estimated construction cost of \$450,000.

Kaiser Permanente, a medical service provider for tenant improvements at their existing facilities located at 589 Los Coches St. and 611 S Milpitas Blvd. at an estimated construction cost of \$434,123.

Skechers, a shoe store for a tenant improvement to expand their current retail store located at the Great Mall at an estimated construction cost of \$380,000.

The following business has received final inspection and is now open for operation:

Inhabitir, Inc., a furniture and accessories rental and subscription business located at 691 S Milpitas Blvd.

Fabiano Alves Auto Shop, an auto shop located at 1636 S Main St.

Heuk Hwa Dang, a tea and dessert house located at 279 W Calaveras Blvd.

Oceancrest Kiddie Rides, kiddie ride vending units located at the Great Mall.

The Escape Game, an escape game with puzzle rooms located at the Great Mall.
