

## SUTTER HEALTH RIBBON CUTTING EVENT

On Friday, August 8, 2025, Sutter Health celebrated the grand opening of its Milpitas Care Center at 100 North Milpitas Boulevard with a ribbon-cutting ceremony. Mayor Carmen Montano presented a certificate of recognition, joined by Councilmembers Evelyn Chua, Hon Lien, and William Lam. The new clinic occupies the entire first floor, totaling 15,000 sq. ft., and provides primary care, pediatrics, imaging, and lab services. This addition strengthens Sutter Health's commitment to community-based healthcare for its 910,000 patients across the Greater Silicon Valley area. Milpitas welcomes the new clinicians and staff who will serve local residents as part of Sutter Health's team of 2,100 physicians and 9,100 employees in Northern California. The Milpitas clinic began seeing patients on August 11, with tenant improvements completed by Milpitas-based XL Construction.

## RESIDENTS CONNECT UNDER THE STARS AT FAMILY CAMPOUT

On July 26–27, over 165 residents enjoyed the sold-out Milpitas Family Campout at Ed Levin County Park's Youth Camp Site. Families participated in a variety of fun activities, including a bonfire with s'mores, a reading session from the Milpitas Jose Esteves Library, kids' crafts, and lawn games. Dinner was provided by the Milpitas Police Officers Association, while Milpitas Firefighters Local 1699 hosted breakfast the following morning. Scouts from two local Boy Scout Troops assisted families with tent setup and transporting gear. This event was made possible in part through the support of the Santa Clara County Parks Department and highlighted the joy of outdoor community experiences in Milpitas.



## FREMONT MEDFLY INFESTATION DEFEATED: BAY AREA QUARANTINE LIFTED

The Mediterranean fruit fly (Medfly) infestation in and around Fremont has been successfully eradicated, ending a 213-square-mile quarantine that began September 6, 2024. The California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA), the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), and the Alameda County Agricultural Commissioner's Office led the effort, using sterile male Medflies and targeted organic treatments to eliminate the pest. 

**308 Sango Court Apartments**, 308 Sango Ct., five-story over one-level parking 85-unit affordable housing development by The Pacific Companies. Milpitas SMART is a convenient on-demand rideshare service that gets you around Milpitas quickly and safely. Residents and visitors can also utilize this service for local daily trips to work, school, shopping, and other needs around town!

## SOLID WASTE SPOTLIGHT

Do you have stuff you need to get rid of? Did you know there are several FREE convenient waste disposal services available to Milpitas residents?

### **Self-Haul Voucher Program**

Request up to two self-haul vouchers per year to dispose of bulky items at the Zanker Material Processing Facility. Each voucher allows the disposal of one vehicle load (up to 3 cubic yards) of approved items. Call Milpitas Sanitation at 408-988-4500 for more details about what is accepted, and to request a voucher.

### **Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Drop-off**

Safely dispose of Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) such as old paint, pesticides, and cleaners by scheduling a drop-off appointment at a Santa Clara County hazardous waste collection facility. To make an appointment, visit [HHW.org](http://HHW.org) or call 408-299-7300. Proper disposal of HHW helps protect the environment and keeps harmful materials out of the waste stream.

## DOWNLOAD THE MYMILPITAS APP!

MyMilpitas is a free app hosted on the SeeClickFix platform. Use it to report non-emergency quality-of-life issues within the City of Milpitas, such as streetlight problems, potholes, tree limbs, and other maintenance issues. There is an option to upload a photo with each service request.

### **SET-OUT BATTERIES, COOKING OIL, MOTOR OIL, AND CARDBOARD FOR RECYCLING ALONGSIDE YOUR CARTS**

Recycle certain items by leaving them out with your recycling carts on your regular pickup day – it's easy!

- **Household Batteries:** Place used household batteries in a clear zipper-lock style bag and place it on top of your blue recyclables cart.
- **Used Cooking Oil & Grease:** Pour used cooking oil and grease into a sealed 1-gallon screw-top container and place it next to your blue recyclables cart.
- **Used Motor Oil & Filters:** Place used motor oil in a 1-gallon sealed screw-top container and motor oil filters in a sealed zipper-lock style bag. Place both next to your blue recyclables carts.
- **Cardboard:** Residents can dispose of cardboard overflow by cutting it into 3'x3' pieces and placing it next to the recycling cart.
