CITY OF MILPITAS RECEIVES INNOVATION AWARD FROM CSMFO

The City of Milpitas received the prestigious Innovation Award for the application titled "Automating through KNIME" from the California Society of Municipal Finance Officers (CSMFO). KNIME is an open-source software that allows users to access, blend, analyze and visual data without any coding. The City's budget team automated manual budget development procedures using KNIME as an ETL tool -- "extract, transform and load". KNIME enables the City to extract data, transform it as needed and then load it. All of these procedures were previously manual, time-intensive and error prone. The automation success within the budget division was expanded to other divisions through cross-training and professional development of the KNIME and ETL tool, and advocacy for its implementation in other finance functions. The award was presented at the CSMFO annual conference in Sacramento. Congratulations to the Finance team!



DEPUTY CITY MANAGER BREAKFAST MEET AND GREET EVENT

On January 31, the City welcomed the newest member to the Milpitas family at a Breakfast Meet and Greet event. Deputy City Manager Matt Cano's 23 years of extensive public sector experience, having worked in various roles in the departments of Transportation, Parks and Recreation, and Public Works as well as in the City Manager's Office will be invaluable as he leads important City programs. Matt will be in charge of initiatives such as grants, legislative advocacy, and partnerships with external agencies, as well as overseeing the Community Services and Sustainable Infrastructure City Service Area which includes the departments of Engineering, Public Works, and Recreation and Community Services. MILPITAS HOUSING ELEMENT ADOPTED

Milpitas' 6th Cycle Housing Element was unanimously approved by the City Council on January 24, 2023. The collective effort with the City Council, community, housing advocates, school district, and City departments will ensure implementation of development to address the housing needs of Milpitas across diverse groups, special needs populations, and all income levels. The Regional Housing Needs Allocation (RHNA) for Milpitas is 6,713 residential units, but the total capacity is 9,397, which represents a surplus of 2,684 residential units. Milpitas is one of the few Santa Clara County cities to have a Housing Element adopted before the California Housing and Community Development Department's deadline of January 31st.



NEW YEAR, NEW LOOK FOR CITY BUILDINGS

In the City of Milpitas, the new year brought much needed improvement to a few facilities. The large building that houses the Public Works, Information Technology and Police Departments recently received various facade updates. Located at 1265 and 1275 North Milpitas Boulevard, the exterior of the building underwent waterproofing and painting. A more noticeable change is the addition of new signage. The department names were added above the entrance of the building and on the side of the building facing the street. A key feature of this signage is that it illuminates at night, raising the visibility of City departments to those driving along North Milpitas Boulevard.

FAIRLY PRICING CRITICAL DRINKING WATER, RECYCLED WATER AND WASTEWATER SERVICE

Over 77,000 people rely on the City of Milpitas' water, recycled water and sewer systems daily, using them for everyday tasks like cooking, bathing, and keeping their families healthy. The City is dedicated to supplying our community with high-quality and reliable water and sewer service.

The City follows best practices and hires independent financial consultants to evaluate the infrastructure, operations and maintenance needs for drinking water, recycled water and sewer systems. This includes ensuring adequate reserve funds for the service provided by other regional utility agencies and accounting for the impacts of inflation and how it impacts City budgets. In 2022, the City retained Raftelis to evaluate these factors and recommend rate adjustments for five years that are fair to customers while ensuring the utilities remain financially healthy. The Raftelis studies demonstrated that rate adjustments are necessary to fund more than \$91 million in critical capital, operational, and maintenance costs to keep the City's utility infrastructure functioning well and in compliance with ever-stricter water quality, discharge and environmental regulations. Raftelis ensures adequate reserve funds and the impacts of inflation are included in their analysis.

The proposed rates are adjusted to be fair and equitable and reflect the characteristics of each customer class. Together, the proposed rates are structured to proportionally recover the cost of providing drinking water, recycled water or sewer service among our various customer classifications. *For the average single-family residential customer account, sewer rates are proposed to increase 4 percent and drinking water rates 6.4 percent each year from July 1, 2023 through and including 2027.*

Official notices have been mailed to every property owner who receives service from the City of Milpitas.

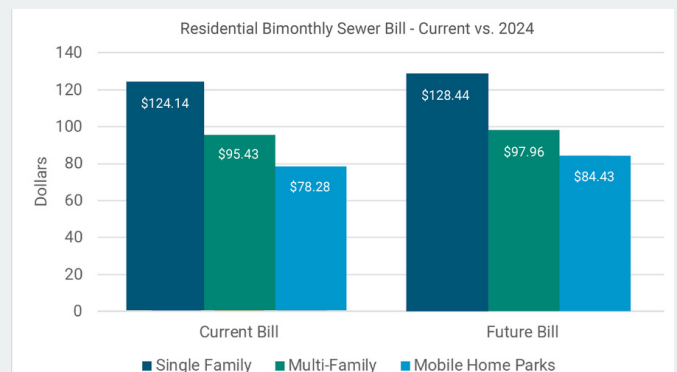
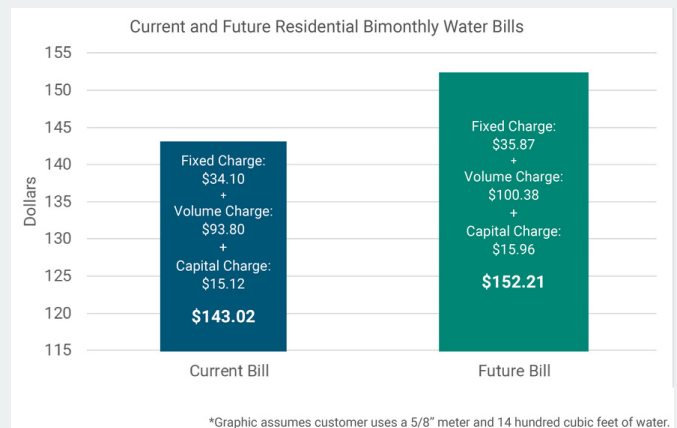
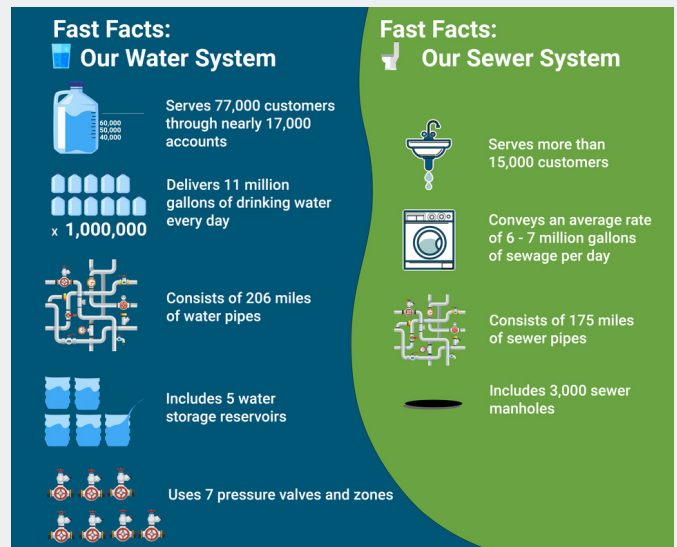

STRATFORD SCHOOL OPENS NEW CAMPUS

Stratford School opened its new campus on January 19. Stratford School executives, administrators, teachers, students and parents marked the occasion with a ribbon cutting ceremony and site tour at its new Beresford Square site at 125 N. Milpitas Boulevard. Representatives from the City's Economic Development and Trade Commission, as well as the Economic Development, Engineering, Planning and Fire Departments attended the event.

The 46,400 square foot facility opened November 28 following final city permit approvals and currently serves pre-school and pre-kindergarten students. Targeted enrollment capacity is 480 students and will expand to kindergarten, first and second grade classes in summer 2023. The facility includes 20 classrooms, a multi-purpose room, library and outdoor play areas. Stratford currently employs 21 teachers and administrators at this site but will expand to 60 employees when the school reaches full capacity. The site previous operated as an Orchard Supply Hardware store.

TAX SEASON TIPS

With tax season upon us, detectives in the City's Criminal Investigations Bureau would like to share some helpful tips to avoid falling victim to tax fraud activity, such as phone scams, identity theft, and fake verification requests:

- Protect your Social Security Number.
- Avoid carrying your social security card or documents containing your SSN with you.
- Be wary of providing personal information over the phone, or through the mail.
- Protect your computer.
- Use strong and unique passwords for your online banking and routinely change your passwords.
- Protect your computer against spam and viruses.
- Beware of phishing scams. The IRS will never request financial or personal information in email communications.
- Secure your mail.
- Pick up your mail immediately after it is delivered or ask a trusted neighbor to pick up your mail after delivery.
- Shred documents that contain your personal identifying information, and shred credit card solicitations.
- Report Fraud and Scams.
- Check your credit report often. If you are a victim of a fraud or a scam contact the **Milpitas Police Department immediately at 408-586-2400.**

DEVELOPMENT PROJECT CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Sango Court Apartments, 355 Sango Ct., (2) 4-story residential buildings of wood modular construction above first floor concrete podiums with a steel bridge connecting the two buildings providing 102 affordable housing units by Resources for Community Development. During the week there was a break in the storm pattern, which allowed removal of the protective tarps on the roof so the remaining 5% of the roof covering could be installed. Project completion is projected to be around June 2023. See the below photo.
