MONTAGUE EXPRESSWAY PEDESTRIAN OVERCROSSING (MPOC) PROJECT RECEIVES ANNUAL ENGINEERING EXCELLENCE AWARD

The Montague Expressway Pedestrian Overcrossing (MPOC) project received the annual Engineering Excellence Award from the American Council Of Engineering Companies (ACEC). ACEC recognizes outstanding achievements in engineering and land surveying projects completed by California firms. MPOC is an important element of the BART to Silicon Valley Berryessa Extension project. MPOC provides a safe, convenient, and direct link between the newly opened Milpitas BART Station Campus and the high-density residential developments, businesses, hotel, school, and shopping mall to the north. The project exemplifies how to leverage federal, state, and local funds to prompt sustainable transit-oriented development that further aides carbon pollution reduction. The successful project implementation was a result of the seamless collaboration of Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority (SCVTA), the City of Milpitas, and all other project stakeholders. 
MILPITAS TO BE AWARDED REGIONAL EARLY ACTION PLANNING (REAP) GRANT FUNDS

Milpitas is one of six Bay Area cities to be awarded with Regional Early Action Planning (REAP) grant funds to support a one-year pilot of [Symbium's Plancheck software](#). This proprietary software helps streamline the residential permitting process by automating the legal analysis of properties against non-discretionary local zoning codes. Plancheck saves time by automating responses to routine questions, allowing staff to focus on more complex, discretionary analyses. Plancheck also ensures that regulations are consistently applied and reduces the time needed to train new planning staff on complex regulations.

As part of its grant award, Milpitas will receive a free license to use the Plancheck software for one year. The value of this one-year license is \$20,000, and Symbium added one year free (paid for by the Association of Bay Area Governments).

MILPITAS' ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST CATHOLIC CHURCH CHOIR PERFORMS AT CHASE CENTER

On January 27, 2022, St. John the Baptist Catholic Church's adult choir sang the national anthem during the Golden State Warriors *Filipino Heritage Night*. The event is designed to bring culture to the basketball court and is a tradition that celebrates the Bay Area's rich Filipino community. 

Presented by the Santa Clara Valley Science & Engineering Fair Association, the annual Synopsis Championship showcases student work in Santa Clara County who are anticipated to become the next generation of scientists, technology experts, engineers, and mathematicians. This regional competition celebrates achievement by middle and high school students supported by their parents, teachers, and schools.

Milpitas secured \$142,718 in Regional Early Action Planning (REAP) grant funds in 2021 to support the preparation of the Housing Element.

DEVELOPMENT PROJECT CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Stratford School, located at 25 Corning Ave. To allow an earlier start of operation, a temporary occupancy permit was issued to Stratford School for the use of first floor only and to allow staff to prepare for opening.

Rohde & Schwarz, located at 490 N. McCarthy Blvd. To allow an earlier start of operation, a temporary occupancy permit was issued to allow for business operations for this manufacturing company.

Headway Technologies, located at 497 S. Hillview Dr. To allow an earlier start of construction, a temporary permit for tenant improvement at this facility was issued.

District Lot 4 (Gideon), 1400 McCandless Dr., an 8-story mixed-use project with commercial retail space and 213-unit apartment, wrapped around an 8-story parking garage by Lyon Communities.
