## MESSAGE FROM CITY MANAGER STEVEN G. MCHARRIS

On November 2, 1983, President Ronald Reagan signed the King Holiday Bill into law, designating the third Monday in January a federal holiday in observance of civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. The legislation to recognize Martin Luther King, Jr. Day was first introduced just four days after his assassination on April 4, 1968. It took 15 years of persistence by civil rights activists for the holiday to be approved by the federal government and an additional 17 years for it to be recognized in all 50 states. Today, it is the only federal holiday designated as a national day of service that encourages all Americans to volunteer and improve their communities. The King holiday also serves multiple purposes. It honors the total legacy of Dr. King by focusing on the issue of civil rights and highlighting the use of non-violence to promote change and calling people into public service.

Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s extraordinary life has touched and continues to inspire many lives. In Milpitas, we continue to make efforts to be more inclusive to continue the journey of bringing equity and inclusion to all aspects of service delivery to our residents. Students are invited to participate in a creative project competition that reflects an understanding of Dr. King's teachings through poetry, art, performance or a video production that can be submitted electronically. The 2022 theme is *"Injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere."* Milpitas residents in Grades 1-12 and non-resident students enrolled in schools within the City of Milpitas can participate. ## KNOW THE SYMPTOMS OF HYPOTHERMIA

Hypothermia is a medical emergency that happens when your body loses heat faster than it can produce heat, causing a dangerously low body temperature. Normal body temperature is about 98.6 F, and hypothermia occurs when your body temperature drops below 95 F.

People who are 65 and older and young children are at a higher risk of hypothermia. Alcohol, drug use, and medications can also increase the risk of hypothermia. Left untreated, hypothermia limits your nervous system from working correctly. It can cause a complete failure of your heart, respiratory system, and it can even be fatal.

Thinking about heading out for some post-holiday shopping deals? Don't forget to plan how you'll keep all your purchases safe. Here are some tips to help you out:

- Drop off purchases at home before heading out to do more shopping.
- Do not leave anything of value in your car for any period of time.
- If you have to leave anything in your car, consider storing it in the trunk so it is not visible.
- Lock all your car doors and roll up all windows before leaving your parked car.
- Don't store items in your car overnight, bring them inside your home.
- At night, park in well-lit areas.

Santa Clara County and the City of Milpitas have partnered to provide COVID-19 testing by appointment at two sites:

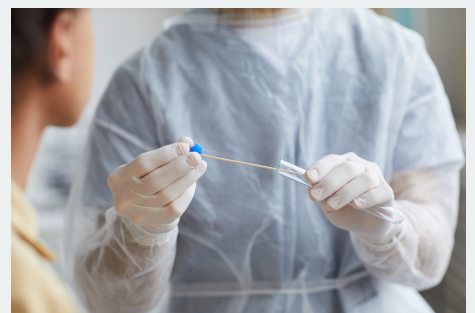
Milpitas Community Center (457 E. Calaveras Blvd.)
