MESSAGE FROM CITY MANAGER STEVEN G. MCHARRIS


In the United States, Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer and/or Questioning, Intersex, and Asexual and/or Ally (LGBTQIA+) Pride Month occurs during the month of June to commemorate the 1969 Stonewall Riots in New York. Patrons of The Stonewall Inn, a gay bar in Manhattan that is now a national monument, fought back against a police raid. The uprising sparked a movement dedicated to the pursuit of equal rights for all, regardless of sexual orientation or gender identity. This year marks the 52nd anniversary of the first gay pride march, which was held during the Stonewall Riots. Pride Month celebrates all the sacrifices and efforts poured into a movement about LGBTQIA+ equal rights to housing and employment; the freedom to adopt and raise their own families; and, the right to marry and share in the benefits that come with marriage. It is also a time to celebrate and honor the people who have

been instrumental in paving the way for gay rights, advocacy through their influence and contributions to their community circles and the rest of the world. In Milpitas, a virtual flag raising event was held on June 1, 2022. The occasion helped put a spotlight on the organizations that provide local resources for the LGBTQIA+ community such as Rainbow Chamber Silicon Valley, The Horizons Foundation and the Billy DeFrank LGBTQ Community Center. These groups host monthly mixers, networking events with other chambers, virtual business trainings and much more. Although we have come a long way, there is still so much work to be done to help the community progress and lay the foundation for a more fair and unbiased society. May we all reflect and acknowledge the courage and resilience of the many LGBTQIA+ individuals who continue to fight for visibility and respect.

MILPITAS CITY COUNCIL ADOPTS FY 2022-23 BUDGET

The City Council adopted the FY 2022-23 Budget at the June 7, 2022 City Council meeting, with consideration of public input that resulted in a balanced budget that also delivers fiscal structural stability. The City of Milpitas' FY 2022-23 budget does not use any reserves, leverages American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds and reflects the City's fiscal discipline in funding City services. The Budget advances the City from severe impacts caused by the pandemic to a recovery mode and includes enhanced service levels especially in public safety, public works and infrastructure, and modest investments in internal support departments as well as contract services and part-time services to support housing, long term planning, and community services. The FY 2022-23 Proposed Budget maintains Council approved reserves and leverages funding from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) to support impacted low-income residents and small businesses in the Milpitas community. The City will continue to transition with incremental and measured strategies to maximize City resources and optimize services to our community.



CITY OF MILPITAS INVITED TO PARTICIPATE IN 2022 SELECTUSA INVESTMENT SUMMIT

The 2022 SelectUSA Investment Summit, dedicated to promoting foreign direct investment (FDI), is taking place on June 26-29 in Washington D.C. The Investment Summit is expected to draw more than 3,000 attendees with a direct impact of more than \$59B in new U.S. investment projects that support over 50,000 jobs. Business investors from nearly 80 international markets will join Economic Development professionals to explore investment opportunities.



The City of Milpitas' Office of Economic Development has been invited to join a small California delegation on behalf of Governor Newsom's Office of Business and Economic Development (GO-Biz) and the SelectUSA program. Other Bay Area participants include Fremont and San Francisco. The California delegation will include representatives from 21 communities including Fresno, Glendale, Humboldt, Riverside, Murrieta, Sacramento, Ventura, Imperial Valley, World Trade Center Los Angeles and San Diego, Team California, and other areas.

MILPITAS SENIOR AND COMMUNITY CENTERS POWER UP WITH RESILIENCY GRANT FROM SILICON VALLEY CLEAN ENERGY

In April, the City of Milpitas cut the ribbon on a new solar and battery storage facility for the community and senior center. Partial funding for the project, totaling \$700,000, was provided by a Silicon Valley Clean Energy (SVCE) Community Resilience grant, designed to offer technical and financial assistance to SVCE member communities to increase energy independence and preparation for emergencies. The project consists of a 75.6 kilowatt (kW) solar array, plus a 125 kW battery. In the case of a power outage or other emergency, Milpitas residents can count on the senior center to be powered and up and running, providing conditioned shelter and a kitchen. Plus, first responders and city employees can use the center as a charging station to power necessary electronics.

DEVELOPMENT PROJECT CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

District Lot 4 (Gideon), 1400 McCandless Dr., an 8-story mixed-use project with commercial retail space and 213-unit apartment, wrapped around an 8-story parking garage by Lyon Communities.
