A CELEBRATION OF FREEDOM

MESSAGE FROM CITY MANAGER STEVEN G. MCHARRIS

On June 17, 2021, President Joseph Biden signed the Juneteenth National Independence Day Act into law. The law went into effect making June 19, 2021 the first federal Juneteenth holiday in American history. It is also the first new federal holiday since Martin Luther King Jr. Day was established in 1983. June 19 goes by a number of names such as *Emancipation Day*, *Jubilee Day*, *Juneteenth National Freedom Day*, *Juneteenth Independence Day*, and *Black Independence Day*.

On June 19, 2022, the City raised the Juneteenth flag to commemorate the historic occasion. In Milpitas, we honor our African-American residents for their important contributions to the City and our nation's history. For many Black Americans, Juneteenth marks the day in 1865 when Union troops arrived in Galveston, Texas, and the enslaved people living there learned of their freedom — two years after President Abraham Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation. What started as a uniquely Texan observance is now recognized across the country.

The acknowledgment of the hurtful way America was built and the recognition of the historic contributions of the enslaved will be instrumental in sparking important conversations among us and aid in the healing process. I think it is important to reflect on the important contribution of our very own Sunnyhills Neighborhood. Known as one of America's first integrated communities, Sunnyhills was a place where one could see a black family and a white family living next door to one another in harmony. Back then, it was a concept that many considered foreign and unacceptable.

May we continue to share and experience forgiveness, understanding and joy in the many Juneteenth festivities. Whether you were invited to or hosted a cookout, participated in an event or church service, gathered around a BBQ pit, let us not forget about the extraordinary gift of coming together and believing in the idea that all of us are created equal.

2022 STATE OF THE CITY EVENT

Milpitas Mayor Rich Tran delivered a State of the City address and honored City Commissioners on Thursday, June 23 at Milpitas City Hall's Veterans Plaza. Commissioners from the past two years were honored for their service, along with currently serving commissioners.

The City of Milpitas traditionally hosted the annual event to give thanks to its hardworking volunteers who serve on the 12 City commissions advising City Council. However, no recognition event was held in 2020 or 2021 due to COVID-19.

MONTAGUE EXPRESSWAY PEDESTRIAN OVERCROSSING AT THE MILPITAS TRANSIT CENTER WINS ANOTHER AWARD

The City's Montague Expressway Pedestrian Overcrossing at the Milpitas Transit Center won the 33rd California Transportation Foundation (CTF) Active Transportation Project of the Year Award. This is a notable recognition because the project previously won the 2022 Excellent Engineering Award of the American Council of Engineering Companies (ACEC) in California!

The pedestrian overcrossing provides a safe, convenient, and direct link between the newly opened Milpitas BART Station and the high-density residential developments, businesses, hotel, school, and Great Mall to the north over Montague Expressway. The vibrant 230-foot-long elegant steel bridge spanning over the county expressway represents an iconic landmark in the city.

SOOFA PILOT PROGRAM ROLLS-OUT IN MILPITAS

Soofa, the creators of the solar-powered neighborhood news feed, recently installed three solar-powered Soofa Signs in the city of Milpitas. The Signs are located near key places of community gatherings providing residents with opportunities to be engaged in city happenings and voice their opinions. The Signs have been placed strategically around points of interest throughout the Milpitas community including City Hall, the Library, and the Sports Center. The E-ink screens on the Signs feature information on local events, community updates, real-time transit updates, interactive polls to gauge community input, and the city's Twitter feed (@MilpitasCityGov) as well as the police and fire department's Twitter feeds (@MilpitasPD and @MilpitasFire). The outer vinyl design of the Signs includes a wayfinding map on the back of the Sign highlighting key areas of interest and historical elements of the city.

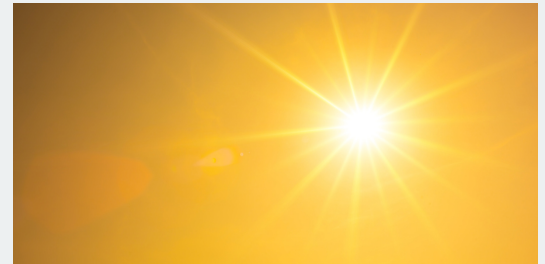

Even-numbered addresses can only water on Sunday, Tuesday, and Friday, and odd-numbered addresses can water only on Monday, Thursday, and Saturday. No outdoor watering is allowed on Wednesday.
