MESSAGE FROM CITY MANAGER STEVEN G. MCHARRIS

During the month of May, the nation honors and recognizes Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI) Heritage Month. The event celebrates the culture, traditions, and history of Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders in the United States who have significantly impacted the many facets of American culture and society, including science, medicine, literature, art, music, sports, politics, entertainment, and so much more. Historically, the United States benefited from the contributions of Asian railroad workers who took part in bridging the eastern and western regions of the country and allowed the transfer of goods. Many Chinese laborers died from working in inhumane conditions and freezing winters, blasting holes through rock to clear tunnels, taking on the most dangerous jobs, all while being paid less than other immigrant groups. The observance of Asian Pacific Heritage month originated in a congressional bill in 1977 by U.S. Representatives, Frank Horton of New York and Norman Mineta of California. They introduced a House resolution that called on the president to proclaim the first 10 days of May as Asian Pacific Heritage Week. The following month, U.S. Senators Daniel Inouye and Spark Matsunaga from Hawaii, introduced a similar bill to the Senate. Both were passed in 1978. In 1990, President George H.W. Bush designated the month of May as AAPI

Heritage Month. The history of America is shaped by immigrant stories from Asia and the Pacific and the native people of the Pacific Islands. In an already increasingly diverse country, they stand apart as the most multicultural community. In Milpitas, the ethnic mosaic of the AAPI group is ubiquitous. In fact, the US Census 2020 data shows that the City's population is predominantly comprised of the AAPI population with 71.3% Asian Americans and .4% Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander Americans.

May this month's observance give all of us the opportunity to honor, recognize, and celebrate the rich diversity, leadership, and resilience of all Asian American and Pacific Islanders. I would also like to dedicate a moment of silence to honor the legacy of former U.S. Secretary of Transportation, Norman Mineta who recently passed away. A recipient of the Presidential Medal of Freedom and one of the country's highest-profile Asian American political leaders, Norman has given our country a lifetime of service and was a great example of leadership and devotion to duty.

GUN BUYBACK IN MILPITAS TO REDUCE GUN VIOLENCE

The Santa Clara County District Attorney's Office is partnering with the Milpitas Police Department, the City of Milpitas, the County, Supervisor Otto Lee, and the Board of Supervisors to buy back up to \$50,000 worth of guns to prevent gun violence and get unwanted firearms out of the community. Buybacks are intended to prevent weapons from ending up in the hands of criminals, mentally unstable people, and children. Approximately 500 unwanted firearms were handed in at the Sunnyvale gun buyback in 2020.

The gun buyback will take place May 22, 2022, at the Milpitas Community Center. People can anonymously hand in unwanted guns and receive cash in return. No questions will be asked about who owns the guns or where they came from.

Additional event partners include the Santa Clara County Sheriff's Office, and the police departments of San Jose, Sunnyvale, Los Gatos, and Palo Alto. The DA's Office will contribute to the buyback using Asset Forfeiture funds, which is money seized from gangs, drug traffickers, and criminal organizations.

FIRE STATION 2 UPDATE

Fire Station 2 (Calaveras Station) has protected the Milpitas community since its opening in 1968. Fire Station 2 was actually constructed at the same time as Fire Station 3 and the Calaveras overpass. While Fire Station 2 has been under a refurbishment Fire crews moved into the temporary station (located at 1126 Yosemite Drive), and have been operating at the temporary location since July 2020. Construction started in January 2021. The station will span 10,300 square feet, ability to house 2 fire companies, three apparatus bays, 8 dorm rooms, and a public meeting/training room.

It is a very exciting time as the grand opening is approaching! Fire Station 2 is set to open at the end of this summer. Fire Station 2 will continue to provide an exemplary level of service to keep our Milpitas residents safe.

CITY OF MILPITAS JOINS SYMBIUM PLANCHECK PILOT PROGRAM

The City of Milpitas will use Symbium Plancheck, an innovative tool that streamlines residential site plan reviews for applicants and planners. Milpitas is receiving the first year of the license for free as a part of a pilot program that provides up to 10 Association of Bay Area Governments (ABAG) member governments with free Symbium Plancheck licenses. Milpitas will use Symbium Build Business to make it easier for businesses to understand where they can operate – simplifying the permitting process. Plancheck will facilitate efficient development review, zoning conformance, and permit scoping for Milpitas residents and the development community. This translates to delivering a better experience to the Milpitas community.

MILPITAS WATERSMART CUSTOMER WEB PORTAL LAUNCH

On May 16, 2022, Milpitas residents and businesses will be able to access the Milpitas WaterSmart Customer Web Portal. The water savings tool, delivered in collaboration with Valley Water and the Bay Area Water Supply and Conservation Agency (BAWSCA) will help community members better understand water usage, encourage water conservation and realize cost savings on lower utility bills.

The Milpitas WaterSmart Portal will provide access to the following:

- Near real-time water use charts and personalized recommendations on how to save water.
- Leak alert notifications and step-by-step instructions to help residents and businesses find and fix leaks.
- Quarterly customized Home Water Use Reports that display water use patterns and comparisons to similar Milpitas households; and Information regarding available rebates and resources.

Sango Court Apartments, 355 Sango Ct., a 5-story 102-unit affordable housing development by Resources for Community Development:

Puma, located at Great Mall. To allow an earlier start of construction, a temporary permit was issued to the retail store for athletic apparel and shoes.

Blaze BBQ, located at Great Mall. To allow an earlier start of construction, a temporary permit was issued to the new BBQ restaurant in the food court.

Chick-Fil-A, located at 755 E. Calaveras Blvd.

The various items for final work on the new restaurant are in progress. Landscaping, painting, finishes, trash enclosure, and arches near the dining area driveway are getting ready for final inspection.

Lantana, 1675 S. Milpitas Blvd., a 5-story, 216-unit multifamily residential with commercial development:

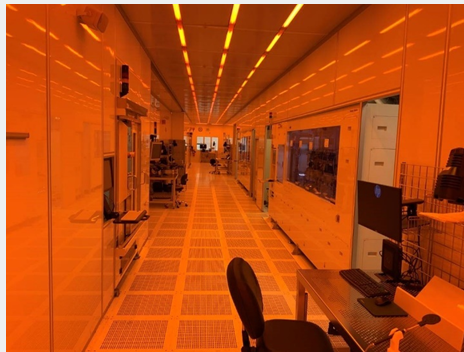

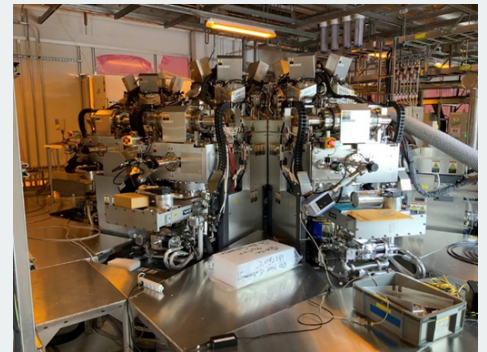
