MESSAGE FROM CITY MANAGER STEVEN G. MCHARRIS

Every year, Veterans Day is commemorated on November 11 in the United States. This is in honor of the "eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month" of 1918 that signaled the end of World War I, known as Armistice Day. In 1954, President Dwight Eisenhower officially changed the name of the holiday from Armistice Day to Veterans Day. On this important day, we come together to express our profound gratitude for the sacrifices veterans and their families have made on the battlefield, at home, and at outposts around the world in defense of our freedom.

Federal Regulations define a veteran as *"a person who served in the active military, naval, or air service and who was discharged or released under conditions other than dishonorable."* This definition explains that any individual that completed a service for any branch of armed forces classifies as a veteran as long as they were not dishonorably discharged. In Milpitas, we have a Veterans Commission actively serving members from every branch of the Armed Forces of the United States. The seven-member commission was founded on December 1, 2009. It is focused on advocating for and providing

superior service to Milpitas veterans. The Commission's goal is to improve the quality of life of veterans, their families and survivors. Every year, the Milpitas Veterans Commission also acknowledges a veteran who has given unselfishly to the community other than their job-related occupation. Our gratitude to our veterans has always been grounded in an appreciation for what they did while on duty and what they continue to do even after their service has ended. Courageous men and women have faced and overcome challenges. In turn, we need to uphold our obligations to these heroic individuals.

The City's Veterans Commission provides up to date information that will benefit all United States veterans and their eligible family members who live in Milpitas. These resources will be especially important to the estimated 2,159 or 3.1% veterans (2019 American Community Survey) and their families residing in Milpitas.

CHRISTIAN DI RENZO NAMED MILPITAS PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR

City Manager Steven G. McHarris announced the appointment of Christian Di Renzo as the City's next Public Works Director. Christian has more than 12 years of combined public works-related experience having served in managerial positions with the cities of Watsonville, Benicia and Beverly Hills. As the Director of Public Works and Utilities in the City of Watsonville, he led a department of over 190 employees providing services through the Wastewater, Water, Solid Waste enterprise utilities, as well as fleet, engineering, streets, field services, utility billing and customer service, outreach and environmental sustainability operations. During his time serving the City of Benicia, he oversaw the completion of an \$8 million smart water meter replacement project, launched in-house CCTV and mobile CMMS (Computerized Maintenance Management System) operations, and oversaw the design and construction of several large-scale water and wastewater utility capital projects.

Christian has a Master's degree in Public Administration from the University of Southern California and a Master's degree in Political Science from St. John's University in New York. He completed his Bachelor's degree in English and Political Science from the University of Utah. Christian was born in Rome, Italy, is a life-long fan of the Italian soccer team Juventus and enjoys reading 19th century English and French literature in his spare time.

PROPER ASSORTMENT AND RECYCLING TIPS

November 15th was America Recycles Day. America Recycles Day is the only nationally recognized day dedicated to encouraging Americans to recycle and buy recycled products. This year's theme was *"I want to be recycled."*

Please check out the many ways that you can recycle properly to avoid common items that contaminate the recycling stream. The cleanest and most efficient sorting starts with you.

Please remember the following tips:

- Place recyclable materials only in your blue split or dedicated recyclables carts and/or bins.
- Empty and rinse all recyclable plastic, metal and glass food containers to prevent contamination.
- Friendly reminder, the gray bin is for garbage, brown for food scraps, blue for recyclables and green for yard trimmings.



Don't Forget...

Make sure to place materials and products in the appropriate bins. Items that are placed in the wrong bins/carts, contaminate the recycling stream. Items that should be placed in the garbage but are commonly misplaced in the recycling bin include:

- Takeout/Salad Clamshells
- Shrink Wrap/Plastic Film
- Cereal Bags
- Online retailer shipping bags
- Chip/Snack packaging
- Styrofoam
- Bubble Wrap
- Personnel hygiene products
- Pet waste
- CDS/DVDS/VHS Tapes
- Dishware

DEVELOPMENT PROJECT CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Sango Court Apartments, 355 Sango Ct., (2) 4-story residential buildings of wood modular construction above first floor concrete podiums with a steel bridge connecting the two buildings providing 102 affordable housing units by Resources for Community Development.

The installation of the pedestrian bridge continued during the week of October 23rd, bringing the major installations of modular units to approximately 90%. Work on the interior for structural, mechanical, electrical, and plumbing is about 70% complete, and finish work on the exterior is about 50% complete. See below pictures.
